# **STRATEGIC PRIORITIES AND GOALS**

- 1.Act as a statewide convener and facilitate dialogues/networking centering clean energy, climate change, and climate justice among and between South Carolina's diverse faith communities and regions.
  - Strategies include working with partners to host<u>monthly dialogues</u>, <u>networking events</u>, <u>and</u> <u>listening sessions</u> with and for faith leaders and communities.
  - Outcomes include development of a <u>representative landscape analysis</u> that includes recommendations for reaching climate and environmental justice goals in South Carolina and a communications strategy that translates the landscape analysis for faith and BIPOC community engagement.
- 2. Identify and connect faith and front-line communities in all 46 counties to resources and information.
  - Strategies include identifying and hosting/co-hosting <u>quarterly workshops</u>, <u>sharing resources</u> and information through social media, website and SCIPL's networks that prepare front-line congregations for climate disasters, provide information and skills for building energy efficiency, and help front-line faith communities secure financial and social capital. We will also identify ways to <u>reduce barriers for congregations to engage in climate</u> <u>networking/resourcing opportunities</u>.
  - Outcomes include <u>increased capacity</u> to improve building energy efficiency, community specific disaster response plans, and pathways to resources and information that build community resilience.
- 3. Serve as a conduit for leadership, education, advocacy, and civic engagement especially for faith leaders supporting front line and marginalized communities.
  - Strategies include providing <u>education, civic engagement, and advocacy training</u> in all four regions through the Faith Leaders Civic Engagement Academy, Leadership Council meetings, and other strategic activities.
  - Outcomes include <u>advancement of state-policy priorities</u> that center and engage underserved BIPOC communities including the areas of clean energy, energy efficiency, and holistic transportation electrification, and the advancement of <u>congregations as hubs of climate</u> <u>resilience</u> so that communities can weather the spiritual and physical storms of the climate crisis.
- 4. Lead and maintain a consistent trajectory toward building a statewide, faith-led movement for resilience and climate justice.
